

On February 14, 268 (according to tradition), a priest named Valentine was martyred and buried on the Via Flaminia, an ancient Roman road. On February 14, 2024, we will celebrate the event by exchanging candy in heart-shaped boxes and eating fancy food with people we fancy. Wait, what?

Somewhere between Valentine's death and our flood of red and pink hoopla, a long, strange transformation has occurred. We all know the drill. Come the middle of February, hopeful romantics will invite prospective sweethearts to be their "Valentine." What a strange way to use the name of a long-dead martyr!

This kind of change isn't unique to how we remember St. Valentine. The way we celebrate traditions and remember our history always changes as we pass it down from generation to generation. Our focus shifts as we remember events from year to year.

The people of Israel faced a situation like this in Jesus' day. In their zeal to rank the commandments and enforce them accordingly, they had lost focus on what was truly important in the law. Jesus took the opportunity to re-focus their attention when some religious leaders asked him a question.

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (Matthew 22:36-40)


Jesus put a spotlight on the big picture of what God wanted from His people – love God and love your neighbor. In two short statements, he diagnosed centuries of striving and not fulfilling the law and the messages of the prophets. Without love, you can try to act out every ritual and command, but you will always miss the mark.

This wasn't a new idea. Jesus' answer to the religious leaders seamlessly brought together two commands that had been there from the beginning, one from Deuteronomy 6.5 (love God), and one from Leviticus 9.18 (love your neighbor). He wasn't re-writing the law; he was revealing what the Father had intended from the beginning.

As we think about love and how to spoil our sweethearts this month (a great idea, by the way!), I hope it also encourages us to think about the deep love of the Father. He gives us that love and wants us to give it to each other. It's so important that he baked it into the very foundation of his covenant with his people. It's a command from the very beginning and one that should resound in our hearts and minds.

John sums it all up like this, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God." (1 John 4.7).

Why You Need Biblical Community

For lack of guidance a nation falls, but victory is won through many advisers. Proverbs 11:14

A severe rash prompted a man from a rural area to come to town to be examined by a local doctor. After the usual history-taking followed by a series of tests, the physician advised the patient that he would have to get rid of the dog that was evidently causing the allergic reaction. As the man was preparing to leave the office, the doctor asked him out of curiosity if he planned to sell the animal or give it away.

"Neither one," the patient replied. "I'm going to get me a second opinion. It's a lot easier to find a doctor than a good bird dog!"

It happens all the time, doesn't it? People go around asking person after person for advice until they hear the opinion that matches theirs. But the reality is that we are the worst judges of our own actions because our opinions of ourselves will always be more favorable than reality.

That's why throughout Scripture you'll find verses like today's that stress the need to surround yourself with a biblical community who will encourage you with the truth even when you may not want to hear it!

The Christian life was never meant to be lived alone. There are no "Lone Rangers" of the Christian faith. So if you don't have a community of others who know you and will help you grow in Christ, join a church Bible study or form a small group that meets weekly. The best kind of spiritual growth you'll ever experience will come when you have others who'll give you the "second opinion" you really need!
