We're really praying that as we look more like Jesus, this place will look more and more like what heaven will look like." When a baby is brought into the world or a follower of Jesus leaves it, you can almost taste it, hear it, see it. But the reality is, we're also living every day in this in between. The moments just don't always feel as sacred. Let us with renewed vigor make the prayer of our hearts "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Let us seek Kingdom opportunities every single day as we are conformed more into the image of Jesus our Lord.



SHILOH CHRISTMAS TREE

India has the largest population of lepers in the world. They have over half of the total leprosy population in the world! Shiloh Ministries ministers to the people in these colonies. Pastor David Glaze was able to meet with representatives from Shiloh Ministries during his trip to India last October. While he was there, they shared with him a ministry opportunity—for \$10, they could provide one care package to a member of the leper colony at Christmas. Last year we were able to send over \$3500 for the care packages!

How You Can Avoid Spiritual Immaturity

For Ezra had devoted himself to the study and observance of the Law of the LORD, and to teaching its decrees and laws in Israel. - Ezra 7:10

In a survey conducted by the Barna Research Group, nearly 1/3 of all born-again Christians stated that all good people will go to heaven, whether they have embraced Jesus Christ or not.

Another astonishing fact found was that while 88% in a recent poll believe Jesus Christ was a real person, what they believe about Him differs sharply from Scriptural teaching. About 42% (even a quarter of the "born again" Christians) believe that while on earth, Jesus sinned just like other people. Around 61% believe the devil is just a symbol of evil, not a living being. And 54% think that if people are good enough, they will earn a place in heaven regardless of their religious beliefs.

As shocking as many of those statistics are, especially those that deal with "bornagain" Christians, there's a very important inference that can be made from them: people aren't growing in their faith.

You see, many people who are raised in a "Christian" home learn the basics of the faith. Then, when they're about 10 to 12 years old, they begin coasting spiritually. And very often they coast for decades, until one day when they're 50, and they realize they have the biblical knowledge of a 10-year-old.

Don't allow yourself to coast in the spiritual life. Instead, like the prophet Ezra, grow deeper in God's Word by devoting yourself to studying and observing it every day!
